experience in the realm of English education.


Course Outcomes: Upon completion of the workshop, students were able to:

Presentation Demo: The resource persons conducted

an informative presentation on dengue prevention, covering topics such as mosquito breeding sites, symptoms, and preventive measures. After the presentation, the participants were taken on a tour of a demo house that was set up to show them how to prevent mosquito breeding in their homes. The participants were also given a demonstration on how to use mosquito repellents and wear protective clothing.

Rally at Taylors Road: To create a visible impact and raise awareness among the public, a rally was organized along Taylors Road. Students marched with banners and placards, spreading the message of dengue prevention to a wider audience.

Nillavembu Kudineer: As a part of the event, Nillavembu Kudineer, a traditional herbal drink known for its potential to boost immunity, was distributed to students.



Mosquito Man Representation:

An intriguing element of the event was the presence of “Mosquito Man,” a symbolic character who illustrated the importance of vigilance and proactive measures against mosquito-borne diseases. This creative representation added an engaging and memorable aspect to the program.

POSTER COMPETITION




